I was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland. My school years were spent in Belfast eventually graduating from university with a degree in the School of Medicine. I began practicing medicine and married in 1969. The major rioting and civil unrest in Belfast were determining factors in my move to Canada. We first settled in Brampton. Eventually we were able to employ other doctors for the ER duties on weekends allowing for more free time. I continued to practice until the age of 75. Golf, squash, tennis, cross country skiing and bicycling were activities I was able to enjoy until just a few years ago. When I can I enjoy spending time at my cottage on Lake Muskoka. I have three children and two grandchildren. Being a part of our probus club offers many enjoyable get togethers.

The first Monday of August is a holiday across Canada. Most people simply enjoy it as an extra day off from work, which is a good enough reason to celebrate, but did you know that the true meaning behind this annual observance is to honor John Graves Simcoe? As the founder of Upper Canada and its Legislature, Simcoe's impact on the province's history is significant – in spite of the fact he only spent four years here. Simcoe was appointed Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada following the passage of the Constitutional Act by the British Parliament in 1791. He founded York, which is now known as Toronto, and was instrumental in introducing institutions such as courts of law, trial by jury, English common law, freehold land tenure, and also in the abolition of slavery in Upper Canada.
