CO-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

MARCH IS PROBUS MONTH

There are approximately 250 Probus clubs in Canada with 35,000 members.

The first Probus club was formed by the Rotary Club of Caterham England to allow retired professionals to continue to meet together for fellowship. Conversation was always brisk and entertaining.

Inspired by these get- togethers, in 1966, Probus founder, Fred Carnhill, came up with what he called "A Simple Idea". That evening, he telephoned 33 friends and they said, "Put me down, Fred." And Probus was born. They came up with the idea of naming their group PROBUS for PROfessional and BUSiness. Probus clubs were, and continue to be, promoted through Rotary. There are now 1,700 clubs in Great Britain.

In 1974, Probus expanded into New Zealand and by 1976 had spread to Australia. The first Probus club in North America was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Galt, Ontario, in 1987. Clubs today exist in all parts of the world, including the U.S.A., Belgium, India, South Africa and several other countries in Africa and Asia.
