# At our last meeting .... (November 13, 2007)

# **Biography:** Dianne Darragh

Both sides of Dianne's family immigrated to Canada from Great Britain in the 1800's and are dotted all over Ontario. Her mother grew up near Barrie and became a teacher; her father was a principal, which is how they met. Dianne and her twin sister were born in Barrie (delivered by their grandfather, Dr. Horton) and lived across from the old racetrack - a Mazda dealership is there today. She grew up in a stimulating environment. Mother was a busy homemaker and teacher, and an early leader of the Women Teachers Federation, while her school principal father was also a part-time professional musician and coach of the Barrie Flyers. Family gatherings featured tales of the exploits of her various relatives all over Canada. An uncle was Tom Thompson's guide and owned several of his paintings. Diane's sister also became a teacher, and eventually opened her own private school for boys – Sterling Hall in Toronto.

After High School, Dianne briefly attended Western, but then shifted to Teacher's College, graduated, and began to teach, living with a friend in what they discovered was the red-light district of Toronto. Her first school was in a tough neighborhood too, but she managed, and thrived, doing some coaching as well. After a two-year break to travel Europe, she returned to teaching and joined the Public School Girls Athletic Association, where she made many long-time friends. And she met and married husband Bob, and soon along came a son and a daughter.

She continued to study part-time at York, finally earning a degree in psychology. Since her son had learning difficulties, she returned to university and earned a certificate in Special Education. She became interested in learning styles, and became a diagnostic and resource teacher. This led to positions at several high schools in York Region. In all her teaching career spanned 25 years.

Now 'retired' - sort of - Bob came home and announced that he was manager of our daughter's hockey team. Five enormous fundraisers and countless tournaments ensued. In the same period, her father passed away and she had to take over his investment funds, which was very time-consuming. However, by year 3 she finally started to feel retired and so they began to build their house in Minett. Seven years later they are enjoying their lives here. Their son has a wonderful job and they wonder if their daughter is ever going to leave University. Life in Muskoka is good.

# **Guest Speaker:** Hap Wilson

Elizabeth Northey introduced Hap Wilson, a self-taught artist, photographer, writer, wilderness guide and environmentalist. He has taught Pierce Brosnan (James Bond) how to paddle a canoe and has received the Bill Mason Award for Lifetime achievement (another winner is Pierre Elliot Trudeau.) He has written eight best-selling books as well as articles for Cottage Life and Canadian Geographic. He is currently working as environmentalist and adventure trail specialist at Red Leaves Resort.

Hap began his presentation with a slide show of a canoe trip through the wilderness. He defines wilderness as "an attractive land, left undeveloped, where natural forces operate unaffected by man." Despite development in Muskoka, there are still pockets of wilderness, and secluded places to canoe, such as the Black and Gibson Rivers. People forget that most of our forest is new growth, after major logging ceased 100 years ago.

His work with Red Leaves is to ensure preservation of wilderness through mutual cooperation with the developers. He is working in over 700 acres that will not be developed, designing interpretive trails for hiking, biking, and cross-country skiing.

Hap then showed slides from all over Canada, and challenged the audience to spot the roughly 1 in 4 taken in Muskoka.

A question and answer period followed, with most questions relating to Red Leaves. Mr. Wilson remarked that an important part of his work involves careful study of the natural environment, and as many decisions about where <u>not</u> to put trails as choices of where to develop. He also said that most of the trails will be barrier-free. He closed with his concerns about who will monitor to ensure that the wilderness will be preserved once it is opened up. This is a highly political issue, and perhaps we need a "Friends of Muskoka Wilderness" organization. Any takers?

Mr. Wilson donated his honorarium to Earthroots.
