

At our last meeting (May 15, 2007)

Biography: Lynne Schroth

Lynne was born in 1944, a second child. The family was large, with many aunts, uncles, and cousins. She was interested in learning right from birth, and knew at the age of 8 that her calling would be as a teacher. She grew up near Oakwood and Rogers Road in Toronto and did all the usual things like Brownies, YWCA, and dancing lessons. As well, when she was ten, the family bought land and built a cottage on Lake Rosseau, perhaps because some ancestors had settled in Muskoka years before. In high school she entered the Arts stream and was involved in all the theatricals. She then went to Toronto Teachers College and got a position with the York Board.

Over her career she taught at five schools in York and had pupils of all ages, backgrounds, and ethic groups – and enjoyed the variety and surprises provided by the kids and their parents. Later on she returned to university and earned a BA in 1975. She finally settled into teaching grade one. Upon retirement in 1998, after 35 years, she received not one, but two of the traditional school bells as gifts from her colleagues.

As a single adult, she joined many groups, and enjoyed theatre, symphony, and night courses, as well as travelling extensively. When in her forties, she met Herwig, married, and became stepmother to two young children. In 1992 they bought a house in Port Carling where they moved permanently upon retirement. With time available for leisure, she and Herv have many interests including hiking, travel, and genealogy – and are enjoying every moment.

Guest Speaker: David Wright - Adventures in the former Soviet Union

Working for the International Red Cross, David had the challenge of introducing first aid programs into the former Soviet states of Belarus, Ukraine, Moldova, and Russia. His job was to turn over a working and stable process to the medical people in each country. This involved creating the programs (tailored to include local issues such as alcoholism and radiation after-effects), training people so they could train others, and creating translated procedures and guides for each environment. Dave mentioned that each country faces massive challenges in delivering first aid, not the least of which is that only doctors are allowed to teach first aid. As well, there are no standards for medical training and treatment, and graft and corruption are rampant. So he was forced to adopt the traditional method of eating an elephant: "one bite at a time". But he succeeded, and had pictures to prove it.

The projects were only half the story, however, and so Dave had interesting personal observations to share. He saw and photographed amazing sights in the Ukraine – the magnificence of St. Sophia's church, and the desolation of Chernobyl. He lived for some time in Moscow and found it difficult ("facilities are in poor repair, and nothing really works well except the Metro"). But again there were many fascinating things to see: the GUM department store, the Bolshoi, the Kremlin, KGB headquarters (now a museum), and famous people's homes.
