### Club Financial Report: Colin Barclay

Over the past couple of months, member Colin Barclay made a review of the club's finances for the 2006-2007 year (distributed to all members with last month's newsletter). In his verbal report, Colin stated that the club is in excellent financial condition, with no problems of accounting or process to concern us. Co-President Arno Liebster thanked Colin for his excellent work on our behalf.

#### **Special Guest:** Dave Moore

Dave has been engaged by Elections Ontario to brief electors on the upcoming referendum to groups like ours. He explained the differences between the current "First-Past-The-Post" and the proposed "Mixed Member Proportional" system being recommended by the Citizens Assembly. In this system, the number of ridings would be reduced from 107 to 90, each to elect a member as is done today, first past the post. Another 39 seats would be filled from prioritized lists of candidates provided by each party, to "top up" each party's total seat count to approximate its share of the total popular vote. Dave illustrated in detail how this would work, and contrasted some of the possible positive and negative implications of both the current and the proposed systems.

## Guest Speaker: Rudy Hrdlicka

Rudy was born in Prague, where as a child he enjoyed designing and building his own boats. He continued doing so after he came to Canada in 1968. He has embarked on many canoeing adventures, often designing a specific craft for the conditions he will meet.

A recent trip was a six-week excursion down the Nahani river system in the Northwest Territories, which was the first Canadian region to be named a World Heritage site (in 1978). Rudy took many beautiful and inspiring photos of the journey and used them well to illustrate his talk.

He and his companions drove to the drop-off point on the Macmillan River and began moving downstream towards the Nahani. Some rapids were passable but others required portage – where no trails existed they had to force themselves through dense forest. They did tip once and were fortunate not to lose anything, since the fast moving river could quickly carry a loose canoe and all provisions far out of reach. They entered another small creek leading to the Nahani itself. Travelling upstream, they once had to pull their canoe through ten kilometres of rapids by wading along the edge of the river. Eventually they reached the headwaters of the Nahani and took a side trip to climb Mount Wilson before descending the river. It is a beautiful mixture of smooth wide waters, narrow gorges, breathtaking waterfalls and raging rapids.

Many sights were seen and explored along the way, such as the spectacular Virginia Falls, the Figure-8 whirlpools, the Preacher, the Headless Range. From time to time they left the water to explore nearby valleys and cliffs which offer magnificent views of the river valleys and mountains. All of these were expertly captured on film and the appreciative audience often gasped at the sights.
