At our last meeting (January 8, 2008)

Biography: Rena Liebster (Leventhal)

Rena is the second of three daughters, all of whom were taught to love music, value education, and live with a sense of humour. Her father was a pediatrician. They lived first on Palmerston Avenue in Toronto and later on Spadina Road in Forest Hill – where she grew up to be the second tallest in her family, ¼ inch under five feet. Early aspirations were varied - becoming an actor, or maybe a doctor - her teachers recognized a talent for mathematics. Eventually she entered the Biology and Medicine program at U of T and graduated with a B.Sc. in 1966. While the next step would have been Medicine, she had married her childhood sweetheart, Sheldon, and so switched to graduate school and earned a M.Sc. Then her children Paul and Debbie were born and she never got around to medicine.

Unfortunately, after ten years her marriage failed and she had to support her family, so she took a temporary job in a friend's dental office – which lasted ten years! Along the way she learned enough to start a consulting company specializing in Dental Practice Management.

A close call with breast cancer in 1989 encouraged her to make a life change, so she started a business providing math tutoring. This led to the realization that she really wanted to be an educator, so in 1991 she was accepted into the Faculty of Education at U of T. She graduated in 1992, now qualified to teach Math, Science, and ESL. She worked for Jobs Ontario and then Seneca College, and then got a position at Western Tech. She learned that despite the rough nature of the students (many of whom were quite tall!) she loved teaching and the feeling of making a difference.

With her children now grown and on their own, she was glad to have made friends with a young math teacher who, it turned out, had a single father named Arno. Before long, nature took its course and they married. Amazingly, they discovered that their pictures were side by side in the 1966 U of T yearbook – they had been that close for 28 years before meeting! Their blended family now has five children and their spouses, and six grandchildren. On retirement, they moved to Bracebridge where they enjoy being part of the Cellar Singers, playing bridge, volunteer work, and fellowship in our Probus club.

Guest Speaker: Ken Garth

In what has become a January tradition for our club, Mr. Garth spoke on "Tax Tips for Seniors". He decided to highlight recent changes in tax law that we ought to be aware of. While there were lively questions discussed throughout the presentation, I [the editor] choose to list only the topics here, without detail ... you should review any you think might apply with your own financial advisor.

- Pension splitting allows transferring up to 50% of pension income between spouses
- CPP may also be split if one spouse has no CPP but this must be arranged with CPP authorities in advance
- The age at which RRSPs deductions are ineligible for tax credit, and when RRSPs must start to be collapsed into RIFs, has been increased from 69 to 71. Also, deductions can still be made on behalf of a spouse who is still under 71
- Some eligible Canadian dividends may now qualify for an increased tax credit check your T3 or T5's
- The Capital Gains exemption on the sale of businesses and farm land has been raised to \$750,000 but complex tax rules apply
- T3 slips must be issued earlier than in the past, to match the deadline for other information slips
- Charitable donations stocks and certain land holdings can be donated without triggering capital gains
- And don't forget to claim credits for pension income, caregiver expense, and medical expenses.

In summary, the talk was wide-ranging and informative. Mr. Garth donated his honorarium to the South Muskoka Hospital.
