At Our Last Meeting ... (October 14, 2008)

Guest Speaker: Bob McDonald, "Being There: Science as I Have Seen It"

Bob was born in Orillia. He has been communicating on science subjects internationally through television radio, print and live presentations for more than 30 years. His weekly CBC radio show, "Quirks and Quarks" has a national audience of nearly 500,000 people.

Bob spoke about his particular interest in space and space research. He included several anecdotes garnered from discussions with leaders in space programs and from his own experience in a weightless environment. Bob also provided many examples of the wonderful intellectual capital we have in Canada and our country's contributions to space research.

On the subject of global warming, Bob explained that though the earth had gone through periods of warming before, this one was different. Scientists are particularly concerned about the speed of the current warming trend and predict that the polar ice cap in the north will be gone by the year 2050. Nevertheless, Bob was optimistic that because Canada is very good at fundamental science, we will find ways to thrive in a warmer climate.

Bob urges all of us to think about where we live and how precious it is.
