At our last meeting January 13, 2008

Biography: Sandra Snelling

When we experience Sandra's upbeat outlook and generous attitude, it's hard to imagine how much hardship she has endured. Born in Lancashire, England, Sandra spent most of her formative years in and out of abusive foster homes following her parents' divorce.

She met her husband, Gordon in Coventry. Together they raised three children, two girls and one boy. In 1975, because of deteriorating social and economic conditions in England, the Snelling family immigrated to Canada where her husband found work with Bell Canada in Bracebridge.

In the late 1980's, when Gordon had suffered a series of strokes and was unable to work, Sandra became the breadwinner. She worked in a number of administrative support positions within the community until her rheumatoid arthritis finally forced her to retire a few years ago.

Since that time, the Snelling's have endured a daughter's mini-stroke, a grandaughter's heart transplant, and a son's brain aneurysm and continuing rehab. For good reason, Sandra considers herself a survivor.

Sandra finds enjoyment in travelling, knitting, reading, playing cards, surfing the web, and most of all, her family including five wonderful grandchildren.

Speaker: Ken Arnott

As a member of the Canadian Harvard Aircraft Association, Ken has visited many of the war veterans who are still in residence in Toronto's Sunnybrook Hospital. One of them is Hal Gooding, a former pilot who has a particularly interesting story to tell. Over a period of four years, Ken & Hal met once a week to assemble the details of Hal's combat experiences. This resulted in the recently released book "A Man Called Hal" which Ken wrote as a thank you to Hal and the other veterans who sacrificed their youth so that we could enjoy today.

Hal Gooding flew most of his combat missions in extreme weather conditions over the Aleutian Islands off the coast of Alaska. In total, he flew 309 sorties over enemy territory, had three tours of duty, and crash landed twice. Now 89 years of age, Hal is one of the two left from his original Aleutian group.

As Ken Arnott observed, Hal Gooding is just an ordinary man who was able to accomplish the extraordinary.
