At the start of the meeting, the members of the Management Committee came forward to welcome new members Jan and Jim. Be sure to say hello when you next see them!


The "Auto-Biography"

After the usual announcements, Perry mentioned the difficulty we have getting members to give a biography, and proposed a partial solution. He led the group in raising their hands as he called out a number of possibilities for their former professions, birthplace, hobby, travel highlights, favorite sports, bucket list items, grandchildren, and so forth. Hopefully this sparked some further discussion at the coffee break.



Jason Swain - "Seniors: Some Legal Issues of Importance"

Joe Ursano introduced Jason, who is a lawyer with the Lake Country Community Legal Clinic. Jason explained that he intends to highlight several key legal issues that all seniors should be sure they have covered, and some of the problems that can arise if they don't, or don't do it right.



He described the "Substitute Decsions Act" and the two types of Power of Attorney (POA) it provides. He began by clarifying that these apply only to <u>living</u> people and should be supported with a proper will. A POA for Property assigns the right to manage one's property if you were to become unable to – say, because of infirmity, or mental disability. It can, and should, have specific provisions for under what conditions it applies, for what property, for how long, and so forth. A POA for Personal Care (also called a "living will") allows someone to make health and care decisions on your behalf if you are unable to. Importantly, it also should specify your wishes for things such as organ donation or medical intervention.

Jason then related a number of cases he's aware of, to highlight some of the problems that can arise, and how to avoid them. Most often, other family members are involved, disputing the validity of the POA iteself, or the actions of the executor. And so it is important to anticipate these, if possible, when creating the POA.

He then had a few words to say about elder abuse. He pointed out that abuse can be physical or emotional; that it may be perpetrated (possibly even unintentionally) by family, by caregivers, even by strangers (various phone and internet scams). These situations can be difficult to recognize, and even more difficult to resolve - especially if recourse to the law becomes necessary.

Finally, he had some words to say about passing on a cottage. It's very important to explain to your heirs what decision you've made, and why, because this can be a very touchy issue. Then, it's wise to have expert advice to deal with tax consididerations, legal paperwork, and so forth.

After a question and answer session, Ron Dyer thanked Jason for his talk and presented the usual honorarium.
