Our Speaker January: Heroes of Climate History Gunars Balodis



The climate history of the planet Earth has been of interest for me for over five decades. As a teenager, I was intrigued by the apparent 100,000 year cycle of the Ice Ages. More recently the issue of Global Warming, apparently linked to CO2 in the atmosphere, motivated me to read as much as I could about the topics of climate, climate change and climate history. After reading many books and papers over a period of seven years, I was very surprised to find that there is now a logical explanation for the very warm period 250 million years ago that had been documented by geologists – in those very warm times there was no ice at either the north or the south pole. All of this is exciting new research has been quietly published over the very recent period of 1987 – 2013 and apparently has not been noticed by the news media to date.
